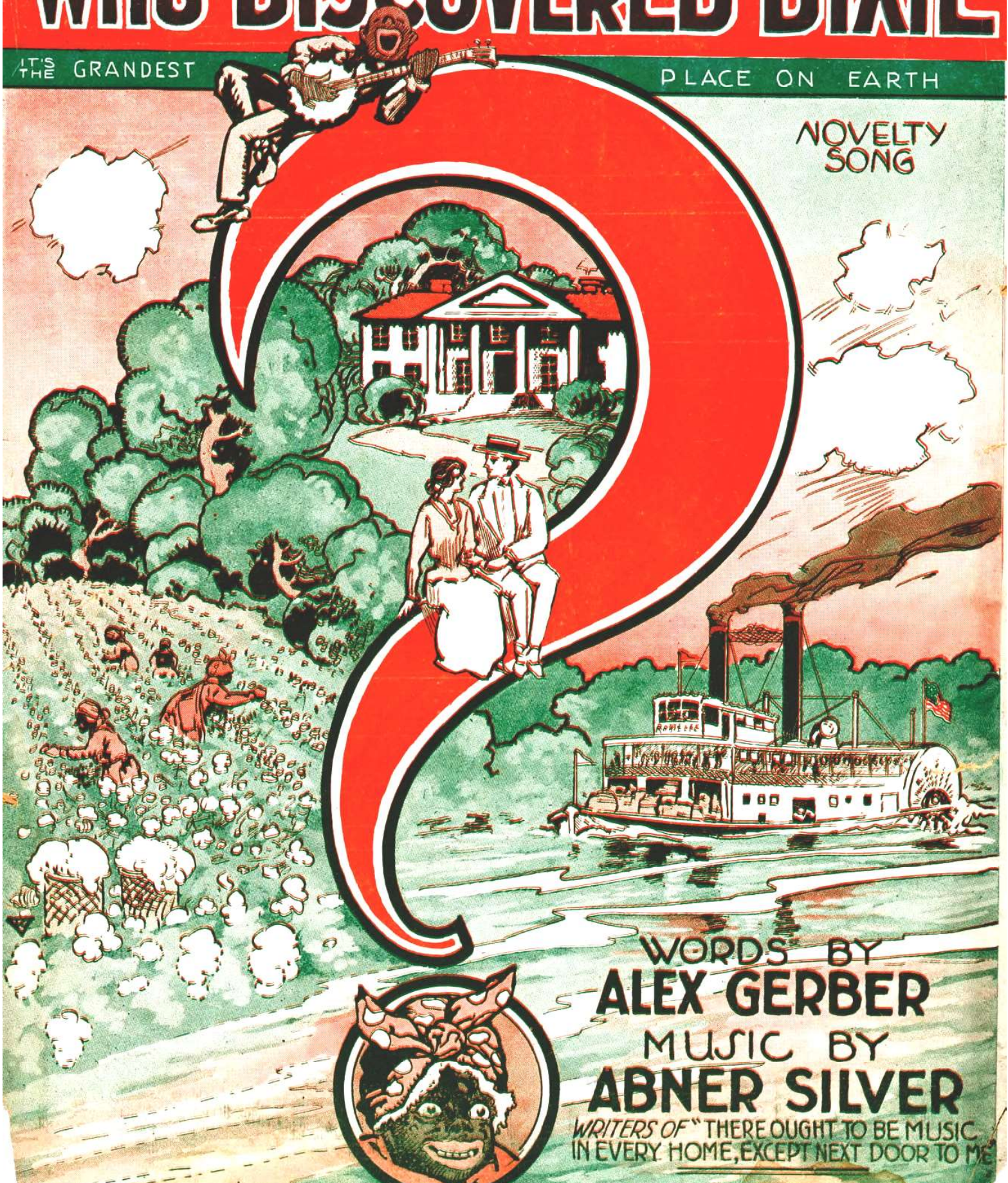

Brightly (*Not too fast*)
